Preparing the Secret Sight Words™ 1st 100 Fry

Introducing the Secret Sight Words™ 1st 100 Fry

Gather students in a circle and place the Letter Chips letter-side up on the floor in front of you. Hold up one of the Secret Sight Word Cards. Tell students that they will be using the pictures on the Card to find a “secret sight word”. Point out that each picture represents a word with a beginning letter they will use to spell out a “secret sight word”. Solicit student volunteers to say the word for the first square out loud and then find the Letter Chip for that word’s beginning letter. Continue the process with each square to complete the “secret sight word”. Have students read the word aloud. Then flip over the Chips to self-check by matching the pictures on the Chips to the pictures on the Card.

Variation: Place the Letter Chips picture-side up on the floor in front of you. Look at each picture on the Card to find the matching Chip. Once you have matched all of the pictures on the Card, flip over the Chips to reveal the letters and read the word aloud.

Literacy Center

After modeling for students how to use the Secret Sight Word Cards, place sets of Cards in a center for students to use. Pair a more fluent reader with a less fluent reader for accurate practice and opportunities for shared learning.

Card Sorting

Have students explore in depth 5–10 Secret Sight Word Cards. Allow them to identify similarities and differences between the words and pictures on the Cards; whether the words have the same length, beginning or ending sound, etc. Have them sort the words into categories. Review and discuss their findings.

Keepers

Provide a set of Cards and Chips for student partners. Have students work together to complete a word with the Letter Chips. The first student to read the word aloud collects that Card. Students repeat with the next Card. When all Cards have been collected, the student with the most Cards wins.

Check It Out!

Copy, cut apart, and distribute columns from the Check It Out! Reproducible depending on your students’ progress. Tell students to put a check mark next to each word that they complete with Letter Chips on the Secret Sight Word Cards. You may also use these sheets to assess and inventory students’ recognition of the first 100 Fry sight words that have three to six letters.
